2. **The BREADPAX™ News** – an interactive web based monthly newsletter that includes articles on topics affecting young people in such areas as science, the arts, intercultural understanding and the art of giving and receiving. In addition, The BREADPAX™ News offers special features including Teen Etiquette, Kids Who Give and the Art and Poetry Corner.
3. **Resources** – links to web sites, articles and books of interest on various topics including those featured in the video news stories, the BREADPAX™ News.
4. **Project Pax™ Curriculum for Schools** – Educational Materials on topics related to the BREADPAX™ mission, contained in the Video News Stories, featured in the BREADPAX™ News. Stories, worksheets and other materials will be available to download by educators.
 - a. **The Story of Pax (elementary school)** – written for elementary school students, this story tells about the people of the Town of Pax who learn about how helping each other and working together, despite their differences, solves a large problem that each family faces.
 - b. **The Art of Giving (middle school)** – An exploration of giving to family, friends and community.
 - c. **The Five Intelligences of Diversity (high school)** – This program examines five different key factors that play a role in developing an appreciation and understanding of diversity at school, at work and in community.
 - d. **International Team Experiences (high school)** – virtual game for student leaders who participate in an international virtual game working on international teams to peaceful solutions to difficult problems.
5. **The BREADPAX™ School Recycling Program** – Brief overview of the BREADPAX™ box and the importance of recycling. The program is explained along with specific procedures for school administration and PTO/PTA groups.
